Changes Proposed to By-Laws

There are two proposed changes to our By-Laws to be balloted on Tuesday, February 15, 2011: (1) changing the night of our regular business meetings back to Mondays; and (2) changing the way we manage the bar and restaurant to using a Board of Directors of seven members chosen by the Lodge's elected officers (as described in Section 16.030 of the Grand Lodge Statutes) rather than the Exalted Ruler, Trustees and three Knights.

(1) Article IV: Meetings

Section 1. The regular meetings of this Lodge will be held on Monday evening each and every week throughout the year, except meetings that fall on the following holidays: New Years Week, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, and Christmas Week.

(2) Article IX: Home, Club or Other Facility

The operation, management and control of the Home, Club or Other Facility owned and/or operated by this Lodge shall be supervised and conducted by the Board of Directors of the Home (Club, etc.) Corporation, incorporated under Section 16.030, of the Statutes of the Order, consisting of seven Members.

They have six lodges in the beach cities north of us, in Culver City, Gardena, Redondo Beach, Santa Monica, Torrance, and Westchester.

As of December 31, 2010, the per-capita donations to the Elks National Foundation for the South Central District, tanked from highest to lowest are:

5. Lakewood #1570: Total \$963.00; Per Capita \$3.88
6. Downey #2020: Total \$924.70; Per Capita \$2.58
7. Montebello #2051: Total \$685.00; Per Capita \$2.16
8. Whittier #1258: Total \$370.00; Per Capita \$1.08
9. San Pedro #966: Total \$2,533.00; Per Capita \$0.94

We are at the bottom of our District with a per capita of \$0.94, and are still far short of our Grand Exalted Rulers per capita goal of \$4.50. There are three months left in this lodge year, and I expect us to reach out and considering making a small donation to ENF, to help others in need.
